Recently retired, André worked for 30 years in the federal public service, including 15 years as a senior executive in communications, marketing, program management, and policy. He had up to 25 employees under his supervision and managed

operating budgets, and grants and contributions of up to \$150M.

As part of his duties, André will be responsible for:

- To implement the Outaouais Branch strategic plan
- To recruit and retain members and volunteers
- To manage branch administration, including budget, staff and volunteers
- To assume duties of evaluation, analysis and communications
