6. Highlights of MEDOC Travel Insurance COVID Coverage Enhancements (Videoconference in French Only; MEDOC Information Available in English)



During the videoconference organized by the Montreal Branch with Johnson, the administrators of MEDOC travel insurance, important changes were announced with respect to COVID coverage which will come into effect on September 1st.

Knowing how important travel benefits are to you, your Association has negotiated an additional COVID-19 benefit. Exclusive to our members, it will be part of MEDOC travel insurance policies for 2022-2023, starting September 1, 2022.

Trip cancellation, interruption and delay benefits of up to \$15,000 per traveler will now include all events related to COVID-19. The benefit covers you or your travel companion if a positive COVID-19 test prevents you from traveling on your departure or return date or interrupts your trip. It includes allowances for delaying travel in the event of quarantine and additional meal and accommodation costs. It also applies to illness or death due to COVID-19.

Plus, you'll get the benefits Federal Retirees members expect from their MEDOC policies, including \$10 million in emergency medical coverage and free access to Perkopolis, the online platform that offers more than 5,000 benefits, savings and exclusive discounts

8. Lyme disease : Do you know the favorite hiding places of ticks on your body? (Public Health Agency of Canada)



You can enjoy the return of warm weather and outdoor activities by preventing tick bites that can cause Lyme disease and other infections like anaplasmosis.

Before your outdoor activity, you can take the following precautions to prevent tick bites:

- Wear light-coloured long-sleeved shirts and pants to spot ticks more easily;
- Tuck your shirt into your pants, and pull your socks over your pant legs;
- Use bug spray containing DEET or lcaridin on your skin and clothing (always follow the directions on the label);
- Walk on cleared paths or walkways.

When you return, take time to specifically inspect these 10 areas of your body (favorite tick hiding spots):

- 1. head and hair
- 2. in and around the ears
- 3. under the arms
- 4. around the chest
- 5. back (use a mirror or ask for help)
- 6. waist
- 7. belly button
- 8. around the groin
- 9. legs and behind the knees
- 10. between the toes

What to look for: You may not notice a tick bite because ticks are tiny and their bites are usually painless. Feel your skin for bumps and see if there are any tiny black dots. Most people get Lyme disease after being bitten by:

- a nymph, which is about the size of a poppy seed (1.15 mm)
- an adult female tick, which is about the size of a sesame seed (3 mm)

Found a tick? Remove it immediately to reduce the risk of infection. To do this properly, watch the *Lyme disease video: How to properly remove a tick*.
