Veteran's Outreach Initiative Townhall.

Public Service Health Care Plan (PSHCP)

All branch members should have received #36, February 2018, PSHCP Bulletin. If not you can download or read it from the <u>Sun Life Bulletin Library</u>

The first article in that bulletin is information advising you that in addition to online access to your account from your computer, you may now download the free "My Sun Life" mobile app for iPhone and Android devices from the App Store and Google Play.

Once installed on your mobile device you can review a myriad of information regarding your account, benefit card, drug information, medication and other claims for the last twelve months. And of course you can now submit claims electronically and receive payment directly to your bank account. However not all claims are available for electronic submission, as for now you will be limited to Vision Care and/or Paramedical claims.

All other claims will require you to submit in the usual manner.

What is a "Paramedical Expense?"

Medical expenses and services performed by the following providers may be claimed online.

- Acupuncture treatment where treatment is performed by a physician
- Chiropodist
- Chiropractor
- Massage therapist
- Naturopath
- Osteopath
- Physiotherapist
- Podiatrist
- Psychologist

Also on the mobile app is a link to "Virtual Care."

This link could allow one to access a medical practitioner online. The link states that on-demand healthcare anywhere is available at a discount for PSHCP members. This is <u>not a free service</u>, but could be very useful if one is travelling without immediate access to a "live" doctor or medical care facility.

Do you have a TFSA?

TFSA legislation allows you to name a 'successor holder' who would inherit your TFSA at the time of your death. Your successor holder must be a spouse or common-law partner (CLP). If someone other than a spouse or CLP is to inherit your TFSA, that person would typically be referred to as 'beneficiary.' Where a successor holder is designated, your successor holder acquires all rights related to your TFSA at the time of your death. Similar to the 'successor annuitant' designation on the Registered Retirement Income Fund (RRIF), your successor holder simply replaces you as holder of your TFSA, and the plan continues with all rights passing to your successor. Successor holders do not require TFSA contribution room to receive this benefit.

The naming of a successor holder is effective in ensuring that income earned after your death is not taxed. Without a successor holder designation, TFSA legislation requires taxation of income earned in your TFSA after death.

This should not be construed as legal or tax advice since each person's situation is different. Please consult your own legal and tax advisors.
