**MEDOC TRAVEL INSURANCE
POLICY CHANGE**

If you were a Federal Retiree member prior to January 1, 2017 and hold a **concurrent** Travel Insurance Policy with MEDOC, your spouse may not have to be a member of our association to qualify for the best rate.

For all members who did not have MEDOC insurance on **January 1, 2017**, both you and your spouse must be association members in order to receive the best rate of insurance.

If you are unsure about your status and want to be sure you are receiving the best insurance rate, please contact Johnson Insurance about your coverage. Their number is 1-866-606-3362.

Planning for the future and to avoid extra cost, your spouse can become a member of our association with only a \$14.88 difference for the whole of 2019. If you would like to update your DDS form to reflect this for the increased amount, we have volunteers available to help with that.

Sadly, we continue to encounter surviving spousal members who do not know that we may be of great assistance to them. If a member dies, the surviving spouse or the Executor could contact us as we can assist in completing the applicable pension and benefit procedures in a timely fashion.

Remember that there are great benefits for such a small difference when you and your spouse have a double membership. Only \$14.88 more for 2019.

2019 MEMBERSHIP FEES

Single \$50.28 per year

Double \$65.16 per year

If you are not paying through DDS, your membership is due within 90 days of your renewal date.

Our branch cannot deposit cheques received locally, please forward them directly to National Office (the address is on the front page) or, switch to DDS, rather than credit card or cheque, by calling the National Office (the phone number is on the front page).

Eligible members are those who already receive a pension except for retired judges and their survivors

5. **President's Report**

Past Year – Your Board of Directors, with your help, completed several housekeeping items in this past year while doing the normal tasks expected of us.

- a) Creation of Branch bylaws – approved by the branch/national office.
- b) Creation of Allocated fund accounts – approved by the branch/national office.
- c) Refine membership list. Encourage you to change to email for all communications. Do you have a NAFR log in? If not, you may not be getting information from the national office. As much as we endeavour to keep you informed about what is going on nationally, we cannot provide the everchanging details in a timely fashion. We don't want you to miss any relevant information.
- d) Changed the Board Structure to allow for many more people to be involved through a Team process rather than the need to attend Board Meetings. Several board members are stepping down this year and a few are switching into different roles. We REALLY need people to come forward and do a small part for your membership to avoid burnout.
The restructuring that we are working through is meant to have more small tasks rather than putting larger tasks on a few.

- e) Purchased new accounting software.
- f) Supported several spouses or family members through the difficult challenges on the passing of a member. We are very lucky to have such a great team that are ready to offer this assistance.
- g) National initiatives – Erika highlighted issues that are on the national office radar recommending members visit www.federalretirees.ca on a regular basis.
- h) We paid back \$2341.54 from 2016 yearend due to having too much money in unreserved funds. To reserve those funds, we setup Allocated Fund accounts to allow us to plan for our future. This was completed as mentioned a little earlier. The good news is that these 2016 surplus funds were put into the Defence of Benefits fund at national office.
- i) National Website – Branch Pages – Hopefully in 2018 our information, including our bylaws, minutes, notices of meetings and other items as we see as appropriate will be added to the branch page on the national website. Just another reason for you to check in to that site regularly.
- j) Paul Mannion is starting a walking group on Tuesdays, every two weeks.
- k) Caring for our caregivers. Looking for members that could put a resource list together.
- l) Erika recognized the members of the board including those leaving or becoming part of a team. There will be a formal recognition of all these members at the next general meeting in June. Time is too tight today to do this justice
